New Pediatric Office Building will Support Dell Children's, Dell Pediatric Centers

The building will feature a children's dialysis center, surgery center, imaging center and a gift shop.

"We're thrilled to be expanding our offices to Mueller so that we can better serve our patients and the community as a whole," said Dr. Robert Schlechter, president of the Board of Directors for the new building. "Giving families more opportunities to fulfill their medical needs is exactly what Mueller's vision is all about: helping the Austin community."

Mueller will be developed over 10 to 15 years and is expected to include up to 4,600 singlefamily and multi-family living units, a mixed-use Town Center, an elementary school, the 32acre campus of the Dell Children's Medical Center of Central Texas, 3.8 million square feet of office space, 650,000 square feet of retail space, a central transit corridor that provides for a possible extension of mass transit service, more than 140 acres of open space, and a pattern of landscaped streets designed to support pedestrians and bicycles. The first phase of the project, the northwest quadrant, is adjacent to I-35 and includes retail development and Dell Children's Medical Center.
